


STATEWIDE IMPACT The URC's **\$18.7 billion** net impact in Michigan is up more than 40% from \$12.8 billion in 2007

URC Infrastructure Research (2012-2016)

\$1.64 Billion in Total Infrastructure-related Awards

- Water: \$205 million
- Mobility: \$408 million
- Energy: \$695 million
- Communications: \$630 million
- R&D that fits more than one category: \$274 million











Sterling Heights, Michigan | April 2019




Impacts of Michigan's failing road infrastructure on communities, and the research underway to meet these challenges




Water infrastructure and contamination issues, including per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS)
