

Michigan's URC Alliance State Legislative Fact Sheet

In 2022, members of Michigan's University Research Corridor Alliance (University of Michigan, Michigan State University, and Wayne State University) employed 24,058 people on federally funded research grants.

- 4,228, or 17.6% were faculty members
- 9,857, or 41.0% were students

- 33.3% of employees on sponsored research projects at URC universities between 2018 and 2022 found work in the state of Michigan after leaving the university, earning an average of \$69,700 per year.
- The top Michigan industries for employees formerly
 working on sponsored research projects are Education,
 with an average yearly salary of \$62,900; Health Care,
 with an average yearly salary of \$62,500; and Information
 Technology, with an average yearly salary of \$87,700.







Spending on Research-Related Goods and Services from Sponsored Projects at URC Universities, by State Senate District, FY 2022




